The March Networks video surveillance system provides Hamilton Safe with the same dependability and ease of use enjoyed at its previous facilities, ensuring a safe and secure environment for its 200 employees.

The solution Hamilton Safe opted for also comprises 48 new March Networks cameras, including the VA Series IP Cameras featuring powerful video analytics, the SE2 PTZ Cameras with built-in auto tracking, and some legacy March Networks IP cameras. Finally, the company selected two new NVRs: a 48-channel all-IP 9000 Series IP Recorder and an 8-channel 8000 Series Hybrid Recorder.

When considering the new video surveillance system, ensuring employee safety was at the top of the organization's priority list. The new March Networks system provides the 200 employees working in the corporate headquarters with a more secure environment.

For example, one of the cameras monitors a robotic laser-cutting machine that can be programmed to run evenings and weekends without an operator physically present, Hoop says. Using March Networks' Command Mobile app, which allows users to view their video remotely on a smartphone or tablet, Hamilton Safe staff members can check to ensure the laser cutter is operating properly from the comfort of their homes or anywhere else.

Similarly, a March Networks PTZ camera installed on a light pole outside of corporate headquarters is positioned to capture evidence of any vandalism or theft occurring in the employee parking lot and recreation area.

Cameras located around the periphery of the building have helped to provide evidence of vandalism or theft. Mike Soward, Hamilton Safe's Electronic Security Specialist, credits March Networks' cameras for capturing crystal clear images used as evidence against thieves who stole scrap steel stored in bins outside of the facilities.

Given Hamilton Safe's familiarity with the video surveillance market, its choice of a March Networks video surveillance system for its new corporate headquarters speaks volumes about the leadership team's high regard for the reliability and ease of use of March Networks technology.
